Hal will review the history and impact of the OER movement on the drive to improve opportunities for students seeking high-quality education, job-training and upward mobility. As a product of the public higher education system, Mr. Plotkin will speak from both personal and professional experience in recounting the key milestones of a movement that is improving the quality of teaching and learning and which has already saved students in the U.S. more than \$1 billion dollars they would otherwise have spent on commercial textbooks and time-expiring online learning resources, according to calculations recently released by the Scholarly Publishing and Research Access Coalition (SPARC).

Bryan will discuss the importance of open science (why), specific open science practices (what), and resources for applying open science within research (how). Specifically, he will examine

- problems in contemporary research culture and the use of questionable research that have spurred open science reforms
- open science practices such as preregistration; registered reports; open data, analytic code, and materials; open review; and open access and preprints
- resources such as the Open Science Framework and incentives such as electronic badges to facilitate the adoption of open science.

This brief talk will highlight the purposes and processes involved in starting an online, open access journal at CSU Channel Islands: Allies for Education (A4E). A4E exists to make research and other important perspectives in education radically accessible, with works published in English and Spanish and made available in multiple formats, including text, audio, and video. A4E is intended to encourage productive, disciplined, and disruptive knowledge through its online, open-access, radically accessible style. Dr. Tollefson will discuss the why and how of creating this journal.
